# **The Grace Trust Foodbank**



"Foodbank" It has probably become one of the most used word in the media over these last few years. We first started with a very small cupboard holding a few Soups, Beans and Pasta. This was when our office was located at the back of the Salvation Army building in Minden St. It has gradually increased over the years. We see so many different people from so many different backgrounds.

Over the course of 2022 we saw 428 individual people and gave out nearly 3,000 bags of food. We saw 42% of folk only once in that year. A lot of people we see are working and doing all they can to keep their heads above water. Yet, they still need some support at some stage in their year. So for us to be there for them is so important. Along with the practical help that we can give, there is also the relationship factor that we can engage in. Sometimes just an encouraging word or a helping hand can mean so much to people when life is a little tough. We have seen mental health needs increase over these last few years, and all too aware of the challenges that some folk face.



Look to the left, no one does this for fun. Look to the right, Gerry Padden, he's been doing this a while now. Every Tuesday Wednesday and Thursday morning Gerry is here . A great guy to have around, he can cheer people up and always happy to talk football, especially this year!
